We are focused on Elections. In every election the church or community group participates with one or more of the following: Biblical voter registration drives, ballot-gathering, Biblical or Candidate Election Forums, distributing or linking to biblical voter guides, etc.

The Goal is to GET OUT THE VOTE! (GOTV)

- That means helping Christians to be informed on how to vote biblically following the election checklist bookmark free download. Do everything on the list and check it off as you complete each task.
- How to cast a vote is also important. There are two ways; either a mail-in ballot or go directly to your polling location.
- Polling Location: We recommend going to your polling location and/or surrendering your absentee mail-in ballot at your local polling location and voting on the spot. This prevents more opportunity for fraud.
- Absentee Mail-In Ballot: If you are using an absentee mail-in ballot be sure that it is clean and clearly marked or it will be rewritten by someone you don't know at the Registrar of Voters office. In addition, under the new

- election laws, you may bring your ballot to church and, if you have a participating church, may turn in your ballot to a designated gatherer.

 under video "Freedom of Preach." It is important participating churches make sure ballots are properly gathered and turned into the Registrar of Voters office in a timely manner. Personal church training is available upon request.

DEFINING A LOW-INFORMATION VOTER

- 1. Low-Information Voters have not developed clear-cut moral and ethical worldviews based on Biblical principles.
- 2. Low-Information Voters do not know the values of the party with which they align. See Party Platforms. Psalm 1. Note: One party promotes anti-Christian values. Please do your own research on www.BiblicalVoter.com.
- 3. Low-Information Voters vote party line.
- 4. Low-Information Voters do not investigate the issues or candidates.
- Low-Information Voters think their candidates have their Party's values. Not true. There is infiltration to take over and destroy God's moral values within the parties. Have candidates sign *The Families First Pledge* found on www.BiblicalVoter.com.
- 6. Low-Information Voters don't think about the importance of elections and their impact on society and culture.
- 7. Low-Information Voters are less likely to vote and, if they vote, they tend to vote split-ticket.
- 8. Low-Information Voters tend to vote for a candidate they find personally appealing.
- 9. Low-Information Voters are easily influenced by the voting habits of their parents and family history.
- 10. Low-Information Voters are easily influenced by friends.
- 11. Low-Information Voters are last-minute voters.
- 12. Low-Information Voters tend to vote based on recommendations from resources that support their worldviews.
- 13. Low-Information Voters are easily influenced by fake news.
- 14. Low-Information Voters parrot fake news, misinformation campaigns, and brutal character-assassination tactics.
- 15. Low-Information Voters split the country apart. They contribute to division, not unity.
- 16. Low-Information Voters are lazy thinkers.



GOAL: Developing critical Biblical Worldview thinkers and voters. Here is a definition of a High-Information Biblical Voter.

DEFINING A HIGH-INFORMATION BIBLICAL VOTER

- 1. High-Information Voters have developed clear-cut moral and ethical worldviews based on Biblical principles.
- 2. High-Information Voters know the values of the party with which they align and refuse to align with the party that promotes anti-Judeo-Christian values.
- 3. High-Information Voters vote Biblically analyzing candidates according to God's non-negotiable moral values.
- 4. High-Information Voters investigate issues and the voting records of candidates: www.BiblicalVoter.com.
- 5. High-Information Voters know their Party's values, and continue as advocates for God's moral values.
- 6. High-Information Voters invite candidates to sign The Families First Pledge found on www.BiblicalVoter.com.
- 7. High-Information Voters understand the importance of elections and their impacts on society and culture.
- 8. High-Information Voters always vote in both primaries and general elections.
- 9. High-Information Voters see the tactics of fake news outlets, their strategies and parroting.
- 10. High-Information Voters are aware of Alinsky-type propaganda campaigns involving character assassination.
- 11. High-Information Voters are patriots, value the Constitution and promote unity.
- 12. High-Information Voters think about the greater good of society and our posterity to leave an inheritance.
